The survey takes 3-4 full days and includes a review of everything from medication passes to treatment procedures, hand washing, meal service, current and closed medical records and employee files. New Beginnings

Community Grants

Community Grants were awarded to three area agencies this year, in accordance with the Association Board of Directors' annual focus of "Children's Readiness for Kindergarten,
Including Family Caregiver Education & Support":

The Rainbow Project, Inc - \$22,000
Rainbow 4K C.O.R.E Project (Community Consultation,
On-Site Observation, Resources and Education)
Rainbow Project therapists partner with 4-year-old kindergarten (4K) sites in Dane County to provide early intervention mental health services for young children and families.

Irwin A. & Robert D. Goodman Community Center - \$15,000 Whole Family Readiness Program

In cooperation with Madison Metropolitan School District, this project builds positive parent/school connections and includes home visits, parent nights, family literacy nights, family support and parent resources.

The Literacy Network - \$13,000 "Ready to Learn Kindergarten Readiness Program

The project expands a Ready to Learn pilot program to include low income Latino families. The program supports family-centered literacy and child development skills that prepare non-native speakers for the school experience.



Volunteer On-line Self-Scheduling

The successful launch of volunteer self-scheduling came after many months of work by a sub-committee as well as years of trials on smaller projects, such as signing up for the signature events. Computerized scheduling allows for greater efficiency and the ability to keep schedules up-to-date and available for all volunteers to see.

Lean Process

With reduced resources of time and money, Attic Angel staff pursued LEAN processes to identify areas of waste from the customer's perspective. The key project we have worked on the past year is streamlining the admission process, where we improved our response time to hospital discharge planners. Additional processes have begun, and staff are very eager to work on these projects that will save time and money for the organization and residents.

Advocacy

One of the Long-Range Plan Goals for 2010-2015 is to be a stronger force in advocacy to impact and improve the regulatory environment for providers of senior care in Wisconsin.

Agency-Free

2011-12 represents the first full year that Attic Angel Place is Agency-Free, which means that nursing staff is in place and does not draw from an outside pool of part-time workers. This provides the residents with the assurance that the nursing staff will be familiar to them and the staff are well-versed in the processes and procedures which are used.

Employee Applications for Saving Incentives (EASI)

2011-12 brought the beginning of the EASI program which encourages staff to submit suggestions for cost saving. A number of cost saving proposals have already been submitted. Cash rewards will be provided to employees who offered suggestions after a six month period for measuring actual savings is completed.




